

CASE STUDY: EMPOWERING COMMUNITY HEALTH

Background:

Since 1965, Community Action of Orleans and Genesee County (CAOG) has championed self-sufficiency through various programs. Acting as trusted partners, they navigate vulnerable populations and collaborate with non-medical partners like schools. Recognizing Social Determinants of Health's (SDoH) importance, CAOG provides critical support, acting as a community health delivery hub.



Problem:



Orleans and Genesee counties faced challenges in healthcare accessibility due to their rural nature. Orleans County's health outcomes are among the poorest in New York State, which is further exacerbated by a shortage of healthcare providers. Data silos hindered collaboration between Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) and healthcare, leading to inconsistent information availability.

Solution:

Leveraging IMPOWR, CAOG established the "Axis of Care" program to seamlessly connect services and healthcare providers. Five partners integrated services like Insurance Enrollment, Telehealth, and more. IMPOWR unified data, while its intuitive modules facilitated SDoH services.

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Outcome / Impact:

IMPOWR, a cost-effective technology solution, enabled CAOG to expand access to vital services through trusted staff engagement, forging valuable partnerships with healthcare organizations. Specifically, IMPOWR allowed CAOG to:

- · See a holistic view of outcomes
- View the correlation between engagement in Community Action Agency services and participation in health-related activities
